The Cairo Lectures

The Cairo Lectures, inaugurated in 2003, is an established lectureship, that brings to Cairo, an individual of academic, artistic, literary or ecclesiastical distinction to give a central lecture/presentation to an international audience on a subject with a spiritual theme, toward encouraging and deepening the faith of both Christians and others in Egypt. Around the central event, the guest speaker gives other presentations and talks to both Christian and Muslim audiences.

The Caravan Art Exhibition

The Caravan Art Exhibition is the idea of Rev. Paul-Gordon Chandler, the Rector of St. John the Baptist Episcopal/Anglican Church in Maadi. His passion is to explore and encourage the interplay between Faith and the Arts—and more specifically within the context of interfaith, encouraging Muslims and Christians to journey together through the Arts. In this regard, he started an informal initiative called Caravan to serve as a catalyst to build bridges of understanding and respect between West and East, Christians and Muslims, through the Arts.

Over 40 premier Middle Eastern and Western visual artists will be participating, including a diverse range of artists ranging from one of Egypt's leading contemporary artists, Mohammed Abla, to renowned ceramicist Mohammed Mandour, to expatriate artists Britt Boutros Ghali and Roland Prime. Each artist is submitting one piece of work that reflects the title, "**Harmony: East and West**," that will then be included in the selling exhibition, of which 10 % will go to Egyptian charities.

An addition to the *Caravan*, St. John's will host an interfaith photographic exhibition entitled "**Allahu Akbar / How Great Thou Art**," using the photography of the Most Rev Dr Mouneer H. Anis, the Egyptian Anglican Bishop of Egypt with North Africa and the Horn of Africa.
